Dog-Gone So It's Tradition

London, England—(AP) —The barkless Basenji breed of nonyapping dog has shattered a 6,000 year old tradition. One of them woofed.

The sound was clearly heard at British Basenji club's annual championship show Saturday and stirred up one of the hottest arguments in decades. The big question was: Did the dog bark or just woof?

London newspapers said it was a bark, definitely.

Miss Veronica Tudor Williams, secretary of the British club, who was there, took issue.

"It was a most unfortunate sound," she said, "but it was hardly a bark. It was sort of a woofing noise. I've never hear anything like it before."

Most Basenjis—they are a fox terrier sized dog with a red coat—yodel. But they never bark—or woof. That is, up to now.
