## **BCOA Electronic Balloting Program 2020**

**BCOA** will make every effort to educate all members on the Electronic Ballot process going forward. The goal is to get as many members to opt-in for electronic balloting as possible. This will streamline our voting process, save volunteers time and the club money. Let's start with the facts.

#### The AKC Position:

The BCOA Board position:

BALLOT 2014-22 APPROVED SUBJECT: By-Laws Proposed E-

Ballot Language

Postmarked: March 27, 2014 Effective: April 5, 2014

In 2013, AKC offered parent Clubs the option to use e-balloting as a method for balloting their memberships. So that BCOA may take advantage of this opportunity in the future, a change in our By Laws will need to be made to include the e-Balloting process. Please send your vote on the By-Laws markup below.

APPROVE: Auerbach, Brown, Geoffroy, Gregory, Hutchison, Jones, Ketz, La Croix-Comment: ["Kudos to the by-laws committee for all their hard work in investigating and bringing e-voting to the slate. This is a positive step toward improving our members' ability to be heard."], Work.

Abstain. Siekert-Comment: [I appreciate the efforts of those folks who have worked hard on this particular subject. I do not feel I have enough knowledge/ understanding of the ins and outs of this issue, or if the following (as an example) are adequately defined: if/when e-balloting will be required to be used, cost limits/restriction of e-balloting services, therefore I do not feel comfortable voting yay or nay on the subject at this time.]

#### **The BCOA Membership Position:**

5 membership ballots, regarding electronic balloting, were sent to the membership in 2015. The proposed amendments were mailed to each member accompanied by ballots on which a choice for or against the action to be taken was indicated. The favorable vote of 2/3 of the members in good standing who return ballots within the time limit was required to effect any such amendments. The membership approved all 5 of these amendments.

The bylaws amendments were reported to AKC's Board of Directors at their January 11-12, 2016 meeting, and are now in effect.

#### **Opt-In Waiver for Electronic Balloting:**

Per the BCOA Bylaw: The Secretary will require members who choose Electronic Balloting to sign written authorization agreeing to use of the Electronic Balloting method, which the Secretary shall keep on file. The authorization is revocable by the Member with a 30 day advance written notice or by the Secretary and must state that the Member agrees to release the club from any liability should the ballot be received late or not received by the member due to circumstances beyond the club's control. Members who fail to provide a written authorization will continue to receive all materials via USPS mailed Paper Ballot. If Electronic Balloting is offered, the Secretary will keep two lists of members: one sent to the Electronic Balloting firm and the other for USPS mailed Paper Ballot.

# Waiver to Opt-in for Electronic Balloting:

The attached Waiver to Opt-in for electronic balloting (pdf) can be printed, completed/signed and US or e-mailed to the Secretary.

Each Member needs to complete the waiver individually including 2 waivers for household membership. To fill and return electronically, when you open the .pdf, you should have a sidebar on the right side of the screen for the document. In that sidebar, about two-thirds the way down, there is a button for "Fill & Sign" and you click it and it enables you to fill in your member name/date and add a signature. To add a signature, you click the symbol that is on the upper tab bar that looks like a pen with writing beneath it. You need to have it "signed" using the signature button at the top of the page—it should give you an option for a digital signature or if you have one already created, you can use that.

# **BCOA Judges Education Committee Report**



We reached a rapt audience of almost 400 judges and enthusiasts who were excited about this continuing education opportunity to learn more about our amazing breed.

Our planned presentation for the Triangle Area Judges Education Group's 5-Day Sight Hound and Multi-Sense Hound Breeds Seminars and Hands-On Workshops in Raleigh, NC in September was unfortunately cancelled due to pandemic concerns but we hope to be invited back next year. This past quarter, the information on Fanconi Syndrome was updated on the OFA website. The new version is concise, with a link to the treatment protocol, advice for breeders, a link to the latest statistics, and a link to order the DNA test.

As to the latest statistics, we are getting close to 10,000 Basenjis tested since the first test became available, good work, everyone!

Approximately 61% of all Basenjis tested since the beginning of testing have been Clear/Normal, 33% Carrier and 3-4% Affected.

Also worth mentioning is that we have 16 new Basenjis who have earned CHIC certification during the 3rd quarter of 2020. The Canine Health Information Certification (CHIC) number is given to dogs who have been tested for all 5 genetic diseases prevalent in the Basenji: Fanconi Syndrome, Progressive Retinal Atrophy (PRA), Thyroid, Eye anomalies, Hip Dysplasia.

# **Review of the Current State of Genetic Testing in Dogs.**



Have you ever been unsure about the best way to apply genetic test results in the care of your dog or the planning for your breeding program? You are not alone.

The dramatic increase in genetic testing available for dogs provides an exciting, but sometimes overwhelming, opportunity for dog owners, breeders, and veterinary professionals to improve the health of dogs at the individual and population levels. To provide a foundation in canine genetics that will help you interpret and understand the implications of genetic test results, the AKC Canine Health Foundation (CHF), in collaboration with the Orthopedic Foundation for Animals (OFA), offers a Review of the Current State of Genetic Testing in Dogs.

This detailed document is written for your understanding – regardless of your scientific background. It contains helpful diagrams and video lectures to help you master the basic principles necessary to practically and thoughtfully apply genetic test results to the care of your dog(s) and breeding stock. The types of genetic tests currently in use, their application in breeding programs, and their limitations will be discussed, as well as potential negative effects of the misuse of test results in both pet and breeding dogs.

We hope you find this resource helpful in caring for current and future generations of dogs.

Dear Club Legislative Liaisons, Officers and Delegates, please take action on this alert, and forward it to your club members asking them to take action too. Scroll down for information and resources on how to take action.

Earlier this week, Sen. Richard Durbin (D-IL) introduced a bill that would make changes to the federal Animal Welfare Act to mandate arbitrary new requirements for certain professional and small hobby dog breeders. S. 4757 - the "Puppy Protection Act of 2020" - is a companion measure (with the same language) to HR 2442 introduced last year by Rep. Brian Fitzpatrick (R-PA-1).

In recent months, animal rights or "protection" groups have been pressuring members of Congress to sign onto the measure ahead of elections. More than 150 legislators have signed onto the bills as co-sponsors. Arbitrary requirements include but are not limited to:

- Mandated indoor space sufficient to allow the tallest dog in an enclosure to stand on his or her hind legs without touching the roof of the enclosure.
- Mandated unfettered access from dogs' primary enclosures to an outdoor exercise area large enough that it "allows dogs to extend to full stride". This creates a potentially dangerous environment for dogs.
- Mandated annual dental exams.
- Completely solid flooring, despite scientific recognition that multiple types of high-quality flooring, including engineered slatted flooring, is beneficial in certain kennel types.
- Mandated pre-breeding screenings. No specific details are provided for what the screening would involve or who would make such decisions.

Prohibition on the keeping of dogs in enclosures above 85 degrees or below 45 degrees F, regardless of breed or acclimation needs for dogs that hunt, sled, detect explosives, or do other work and thrive in cooler temperatures, or must be acclimated to cooler or warmer temperatures for their safety.

#### Further, it prohibits the breeding of a female dog:

- Unless pre-screened by a veterinarian
- If it would produce more than two litters in an 18-month period.

Based arbitrarily on the age and size of the dog.

While some portions of the measures include reasonable *generalized* guidelines for canine care, *arbitrary requirements that ignore best practices for individual outcomes are not appropriate for federal mandates*. Arbitrary, one-size-fits-all requirements do not take into account the broad range of breeds and types of dogs or best health and breeding practices. They also do not allow for creative approaches that allow expert breeders and owners to provide optimal care for their individual dogs and advance the art and science of responsible dog breeding.

#### **How This Impacts You:**

These measures would apply to anyone who is subject to USDA breeder/dealer licensing. Breeders are subject to USDA licensing if they maintain more than 4 "breeding females" (a term that is undefined but is generally considered to mean an intact female) and sell or transfer even one of the offspring "sight unseen". "Breeding females" include *any combination of* cats, dogs, or other small pet mammals such as hamsters, guinea pigs, etc. (Learn more).

#### What you Can Do:

Most members of Congress want to do the right thing for dogs, but they are not experts in this area. It's likely they do not understand the nuances or unintended consequences of arbitrary legislation that may "sound good" to a non-expert. They also hear a lot from animal rights/ protection groups, and they also rely on hearing from constituents. Unless we help educate our lawmakers, we will be subject to bad laws.

Your member of Congress needs to hear from you. Please **contact your member of Congress and your U.S. Senators today**. Visit AKC's Legislative Action Center and type your address in the "Find Your Elected Officials" box to find out who represents you and get their contact information.

#### Tell them:

H.R. 2442/S. 4757 mandate arbitrary one-size-fits-all requirements for temperatures, kennel engineering standards, and breeding bans that are not appropriate for all types or breeds of dogs and could harm some dogs.

Explain you are a constituent. Respectfully share your experience and concerns as a dog owner/breeder/expert and based on the talking points above.

Ask them to not support advancing the bills out of committee.
